# WERS is facing a funding crisis.....

Just before Christmas we learned that we had been knocked back by our biggest funder, Big Lottery, and this was devastating news. Our current Big Lottery grant finishes at the end of May and two other substantial grants are due to come to an end around the same time. WERS is therefore facing an unprecedented fundraising challenge. In discussion with our trustees, it has been decided to be open about our financial situation in the hope that new and existing supporters across the region will come to our aid.

#### but we are determined to secure its future!

WERS is exploring a wide range of funding sources, including crowdfunding, increasing individual giving and support from businesses as well as trusts and foundations on which WERS has principally relied for its core funding in the past. We have just secured a £30,000 donation from a new funder, the ArmTrust, and hope that this will be the first of many new grants and donations. We are also in the first year of two 3 year grants from Lloyds Bank Foundation and Shears Foundation.

## Why WERS is needed

Asylum seekers and refugees living in Newcastle rely on WERS for their basic needs and, for the last 17 years, have come to the project in ever- increasing numbers. Last year WERS supported 520 men and women and reached out to 1,866 local people through its education and awareness work.

'In alleviating the worst experiences of destitution, disadvantage, exclusion, isolation and poverty among stakeholders, the social impact of WERS is immense. It is hard to fathom what the impacts upon Tyneside and the North East might be in the absence of a service so rich in experience and rare skills.'
